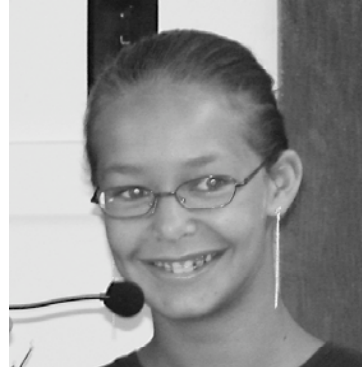

respite time for a couple of hours.

"Our annual volunteer training is offered as an effort to recruit and train new volunteers as well as to provide our community members with important information about caring for someone who is dying. This isn't a topic that is discussed often among family members and friends, yet it is likely that we will all experience the death of a loved one at some point and we may be providing the care and support for a dying family member," Gail Tattan-Giampaolo, Director of WMC's Home Health and Hospice, explained. "This training is designed to prepare volunteers for their work with hospice patients and to provide much needed information about the dying process to anyone interested in learning more."

Topics covered during the training include the history and philosophy of hospice, communication skills, spirituality in hospice, caring for ourselves as caregivers, dealing with difficult family dynamics, comfort care
